New Carers

If you wish to become a **Registered Wildlife Rehabilitator** with Wildcare Australia (ie attend rescues, care for sick/injured wildlife), you **MUST** complete the Orientation Program. Once you have completed this Orientation Program, **THEN** you will be covered under Wildcare's Rehabilitation Permit and Insurance Cover for the rescue of wildlife. You must complete the Orientation Program **before** attending other training workshops. Courses listed as a Basic course **MUST** be completed prior to attending the Advanced workshop.

Advanced/Experienced Carers

As part of your obligation of **remaining** a Registered Wildlife Rehabilitator with Wildcare Australia and in order to satisfy the requirements of your Rehabilitation Permit Endorsement, you must complete at least **ONE** workshop **EACH YEAR** of the species that you are caring for. This will enable you to keep up to date with the current methods of care for that species. Advanced workshops are generally updated each year.
